



Entrepreneur Empowerment Program:

FINAL 12 MONTH REPORT

Flyte's second Entrepreneur Empowerment Program launched in May 2022. Our cohort consisted of 50 early-stage small businesses in New Orleans, primarily owned by Black women with children. This brief report summarizes the cohort's progress during the full 12 months of the program. This data is collected through detailed surveys of cohort members throughout the life of our program.

Our program model relies on a **large network** of **established partnerships** with **professionals** around the city that donate their services in-kind to Flyte. This allows us to serve such a large cohort with a relatively small budget.

This program tackles the barriers that business owners of color experience accessing the capital that is critical to strengthen and expand their businesses. The following resources are provided for each cohort member during the program:

- · 32+ hours of personal and business finance training from our local banking partners
 - 12+ hours of professional mentorship
 - Access to free professional services including business planning, marketing, branding, logos, credit building, retirement planning and more
 - · Interest free micro-loans

ALEXANDER BIGBIE, 35 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, FLYTE

Alexander Bigbie moved from London to New Orleans on a pedicab. Kind of. Bigbie fell in love with New Orleans after one visit, and left his job as a banker with Barclays to pedicab

love with New Orleans after one visit, and left his job as a banker with Barclays to pedicab while starting his financial literacy program Flyte, which stands for Financial Learning You Take Everywhere. Although Flyte can apply to anyone, its financial tips are specifically targeted toward young adults. "Without pedicabbing, it would have been hard to get Flyte off the ground," Bigble says. The flexibility provided a steady income and time to focus on his career.

Bigble worked at Propeller, a nonprofit focused on creating more sustainable futures for entrepreneurs, and Liberty's Kitchen, a nonprofit for youth, where he taught finance classes.

It was there he realized financial literacy could help combat systemic inequalities. Flyte was born. The free program caters to businesses making less than \$100,000 a year and those with low-to-moderate incomes. Flyte entrepreneurs work with financial institutions, volunteers and organizations to strengthen skills in analytics, client contact, attendee recruitment and reporting in regards to their business.



"We've had business owners who were able to raise their credit scores by over 100 points and get their first business loan," Bigbie says. "It's a feeling money can't buy. And in a city that I really love, it's the best feeling in the world." – Sinclair McKinney

90% of participants' credit scores increased.


Of those, **68%** saw it increase by at least **20 points**.



Confidence in Personal Finances

During our program, **66%** of our participants met with a **financial planner**.

On average, participants in our program reported that their confidence in their personal finances increased by over **80%**.



Confidence with personal finances increased

dramatically over the course of the program.

60% of participants were able to pay off personal debt during the program. 80% of our cohort began working regularly with a financial planner during the program.



Outside of financial planning assistance, each member of our cohort met with an average of **five** professionals who helped them with their business needs


